

WHAT ARE MY OPTIONS NOW?

Young people are expected to stay in education or training until they are 18

- **Traineeship** → A training course to help step up into an Apprenticeship by boosting skills and getting work experience.
- **Apprenticeship** → A job with recognised training for qualifications so you can earn while you learn.
- **School/College/University** → Study for recognised qualifications.
- **Straight into work** → Check that there is accredited training to get the best long-term prospects.

TOP TIP

Keep trying! You won't always get the first opportunity you apply for and vacancies are advertised year round

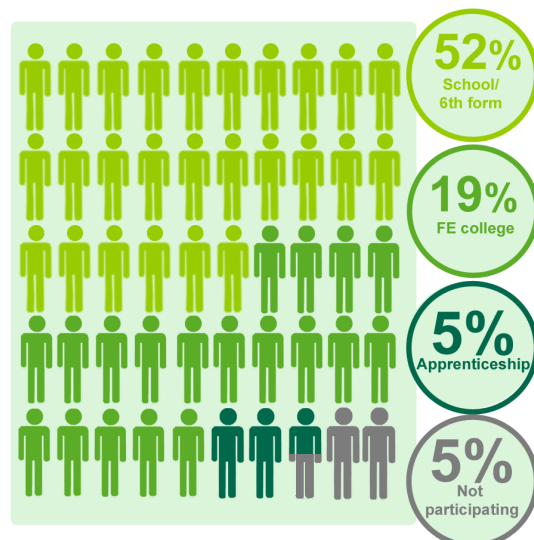
