# Principles of care in health & social care settings

## 1 hour 15 mins exam paper looking at:

- ▶ **Rights of service users** -what they are/ how to maintain them and benefits to individuals
- ▶ **Person centred values of care** & how they can be applied when caring for individuals & **the 6C's** – how to apply them & the benefits to individuals
- ▶ **Effective communication** with individuals – how to use them and the benefits of good communication
- ▶ **Protecting service users & providers** by looking at safeguarding, safety and hygiene

# Supporting individuals through life events

## Coursework – 30%

You will base your **coursework on an interview of an individual you know**, who agrees to take part in your study. **Your investigation and report will have to cover**

- ▶ **The life stages** - from 4 – over 65 – PIES **development and factors** affecting them
- ▶ **Life events** – such as physical events , relationship changes & life circumstances. Individuals will have **needs** due to these changes and there will be **impacts** on the individual.
- ▶ **Sources of support** – formal & informal **people and organisations that can help** them




## How do Cambridge Nationals grades compare to GCSE (9–1)?

Grades for Cambridge Nationals and for GCSEs align at key points.

Level 1 covers GCSE grades 3–1 (or D–G) and Level 2 GCSE grades 9–4 (or A\*–C).

- The bottom of a Level 1 Pass is aligned to GCSE grade 1
- The bottom of a Level 2 Pass is aligned to GCSE grade 4
- The bottom of a Level 2 Distinction is aligned to GCSE grade 7
