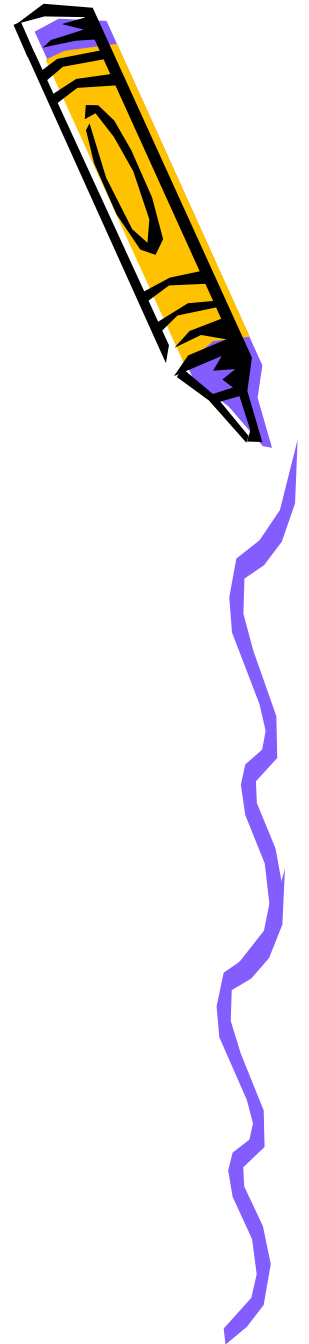


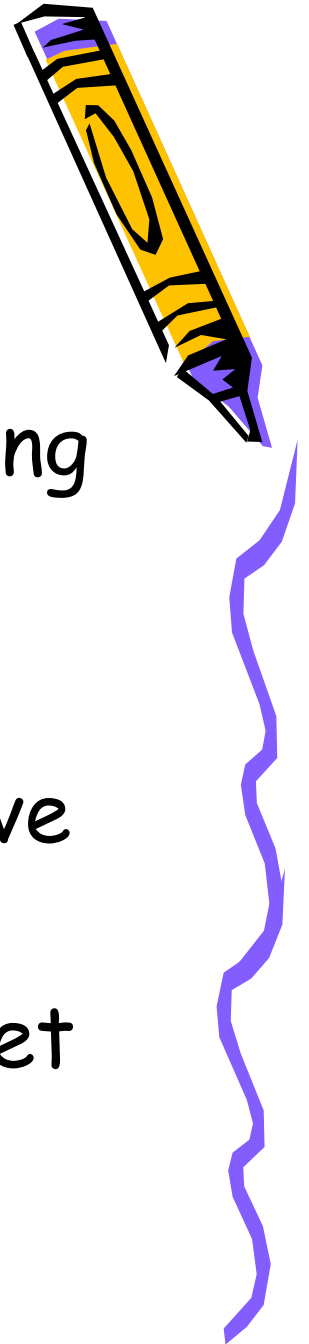

Friday 24th May.



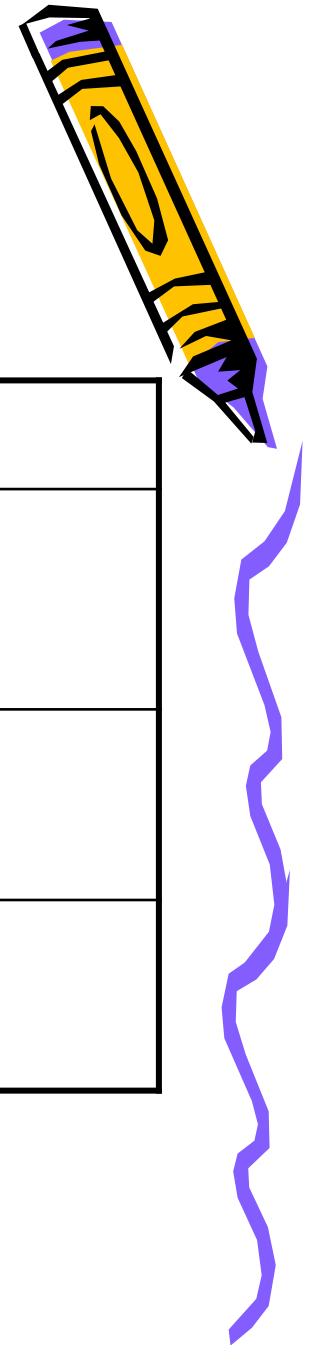
On your marks, get set.....GO

Start Revision and Planning over Easter



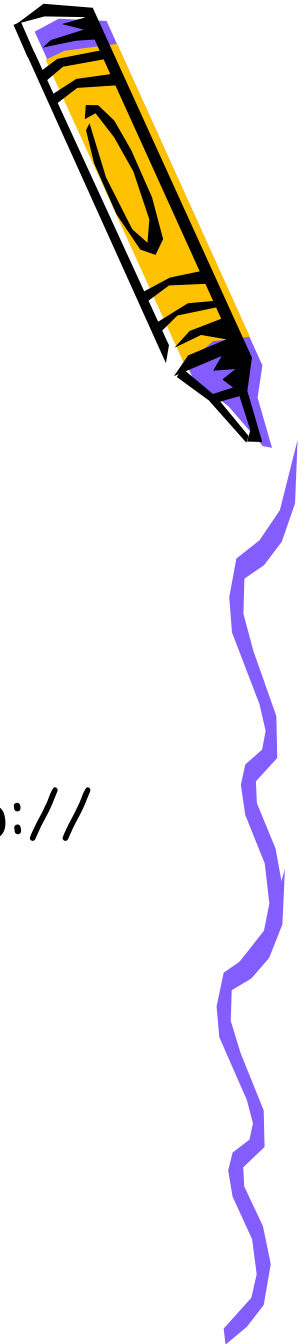
- Identify times for revision - days / $\frac{1}{2}$ days/ evenings

- Once you get started the easier it becomes



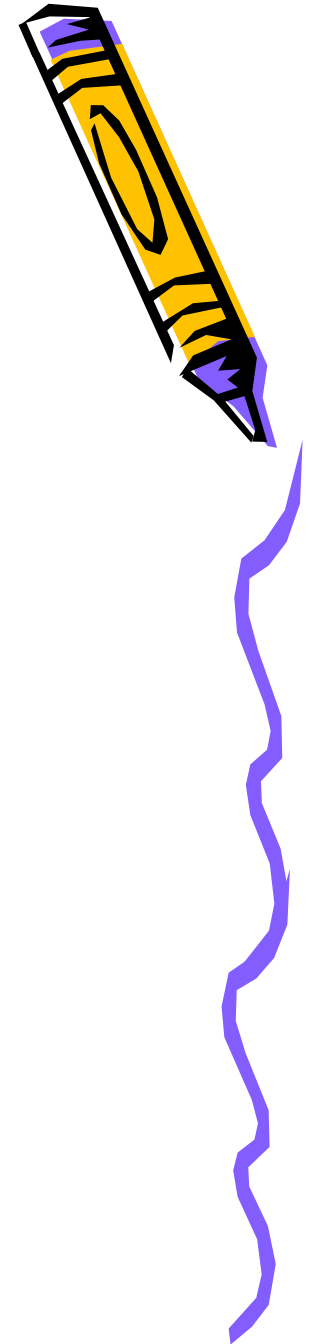

Activities

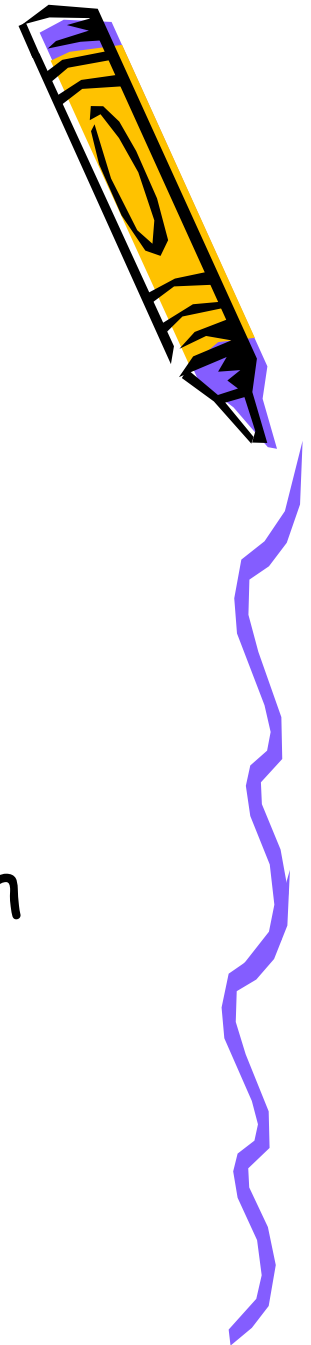
- Highlight notes
- Summarise key points - use cards/large sheets of paper/stickers.
- Summarise again
- Use textbook/text to follow up things you don't understand or gaps.
- Learn information - How do you do this best?



Learning Information

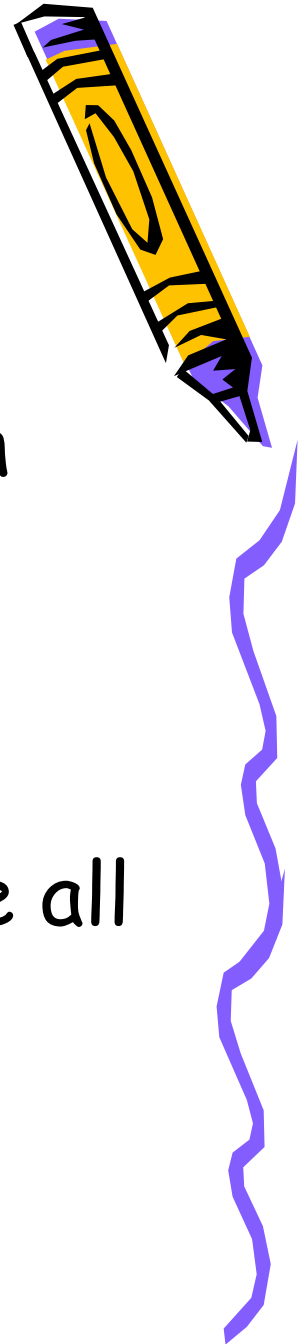
We learn in different ways:

- Initial letter words
- Pictures
- Stories with key words
- Mind Maps - (Spider diagrams with pictures)
- Large Charts



Keep Testing Yourself

- Work with a **partner** and test each other.
- Repeat key facts - into a **tape recorder**.
- Use a **spider diagram** to summarise all you know.



LSCWC

- **Look** at what you are learning
- **Say** out loud what you need to learn
- **Cover** up what you have learnt
- Without looking **write** down what you have learnt
- **Check** you have memorised what you need to learn.



Practise Questions

- Know the paper and nature of the questions
- Know the marking scheme - What are the examiners looking for
- Practise questions / papers **TO TIME**
- Make up your own questions and answer them
